

Pupil Premium Impact 2022-23 (Attainment and progress)

The DfE expects schools to compare attainment for PP pupils against their peers who are non-pupil premium to see if we are 'closing the gap'. It should be remembered that some PP children are also SEND and therefore have additional barriers to attainment. In all cases we also look at individual progress from starting points.

Y1 (8 pupils) (4 of these are SEND)

Reading and maths – in line with non-Pupil Premium

Writing – just below

Reading – 63% expected progress 38% above expected progress

Writing – 50% expected progress 50% above expected progress

Maths 25% expected progress 75% above expected progress

Y2 (4 pupils) (1 pupil with SEND)

Reading and maths – in line with non-pupil premium

Writing – just below

Y3 (8 pupils) (4 with SEND)

Reading – in line with non-pupil premium

Writing and maths – just below

Reading – 63% expected progress 25% above expected progress

Writing – 50% expected progress

Maths – 63% expected progress 25% above expected progress

Y4 (8 pupils) (2 with SEND/1 EHCP)

Reading and writing – in line with non-pupil premium

Maths – just below

Reading – 63% expected progress 37% above expected progress

Writing - 63% expected progress 37% above expected progress

Maths – 88% expected progress 12% above expected progress

Y5 (6 pupils) (3 with SEND)

Reading – in line with non-pupil premium

Writing and maths – just below

Reading – 67% expected progress

Writing – 67% expected progress

Maths – 67% expected progress 17% above expected progress

Y6 (9 pupils) (4 with SEND)

Reading – in line with non-pupil premium

Writing and maths – just below

Reading – 78% expected progress 11% above expected progress

Writing – 56% expected progress 44% above expected progress

Maths – 78% expected progress 22% above expected progress
